



5 priority issues (themes) for capacity building

- 1. Diversify the forms of academic cooperation within and across HEIs:
- Contribute to the creation of clusters, facilitate interdisciplinary research and internationalization.
- 2. Strengthen links with external partners:
- Support researchers in knowledge transfer and commercialization through technical assistance, guidance, and training;
 - 3. Contribute to setting national and institutional research priorities:
- Improve internal mechanisms for strategic planning and evaluation, create shared space for the participatory decision between partners and other stakeholders;
 - 4. Improve human resources management in research:
- Help researchers to develop research management skills, strengthen functional linkages across administrative and research units within the university for more efficient management of research activities;
 - 5. Introduce a result-based management system and a shared information portal:
- Develop an information system with common procedure of gathering data and a clear database structure. The database should be linked to external international databases of research output to validate the results and reflect the national goals of research performance evaluation.





Achieving the Goals

- **➤** Software development (lead by TSU)
- > Finalizing HERD configured system for TSU
- **➤** Distributing system to other Universities.
- **Electronic registration of the target group**
- ➤ Manuals (English/Georgian versions)
- ➤ Recruiting academic and research staff for ToT
- >Provision of the trainings for academic staff and Ph.D students.





Challenges

Institutional Level

- Computer Literacy (skills)
- Other internal and external systems for personnel to fill in
- Scale and profile of the Universities
- Poor response from researchers and low incentives for integration of data from their side – more active are Ph.D students who are looking for possibilities for more visibility.

System Level

- Translation to Georgian
- Specific system requirements for Georgian Users
- Modification Options
- Limited possibilities for integration the data from the other databases (Clarivate, Scopus, PubMed, ERICH, Science Direct, JSTOR and etc.)
- Validation of research results which are not indexed in Scopus or anther citation and bibliographic databases with proper scientific value

State Level

- Existence of a several systems In Georgian, research portals are having the similar goals — TUD initiated to apply for the additional project for synchronizing and harmonizing all the 4 portals together.
- Accessibility to consolidated information about researcher
- Research evaluation




Outcomes-Georgian Research Portal

- ☐ Research Data Management -first internal software for collecting and analyzing data.
- ☐ Collected and analyzed data will help indicate main direction in research/creative activities and define strategy for farther development of research activities in Universities.
- ☐ Will help research management units in research related data collection and processing.
- Will optimize research capacity and support institutional cooperation.
- ☐ Will support and simplify the internal procedure for engagement in various international rankings;
- ☐ Will be used to apply analytical data for the enhancement of performance based efficiency of the HEI within the PDCA cycle;
- ☐ Will simplify self-assessment and reporting process for national and international accreditations;
- ☐ Will help institutions to share research infrastructure and find potential collaborators.
